





Easy Read: Freedom Festival 2024

When is it?








- Activities at Freedom Festival will take place between Wednesday 28th of August and Sunday 1st September
- Most activities will take place on Saturday 31st August and Sunday 1st of September between 11am and 8pm.
- You don't have to stay the whole time.

Where is it?



Freedom Festival will happen across Hull city centre.

Places like Zebedee's Yard, Princes Dock Street and Trinity Square will have lots of shows and activities.

The numbers on the map match the locations in the programme.

How to get there:



- Paragon Interchange bus and train station is about a fifteen-minute walk to the festival.
- There are blue badge parking bays on streets around the festival and in several car parks that are close by
- There is more travel information on our website access page including a list of car parks

Accessible Toilets




- RevoLOOtion will be in Zebedee's Yard from Friday 30th of August to Sunday 1st of September.
